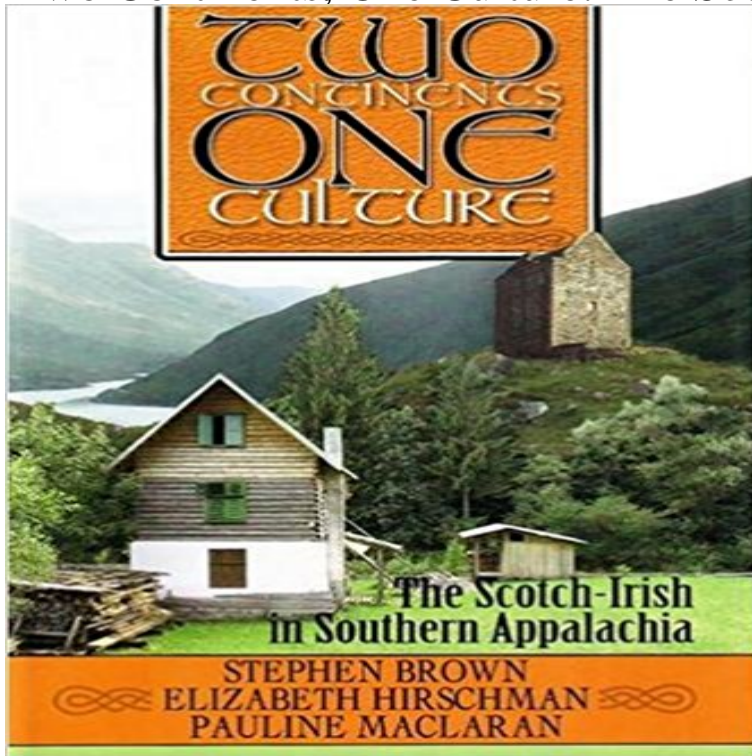


Two Continents, One Culture: The Scotch-Irish in Southern Appalachia
