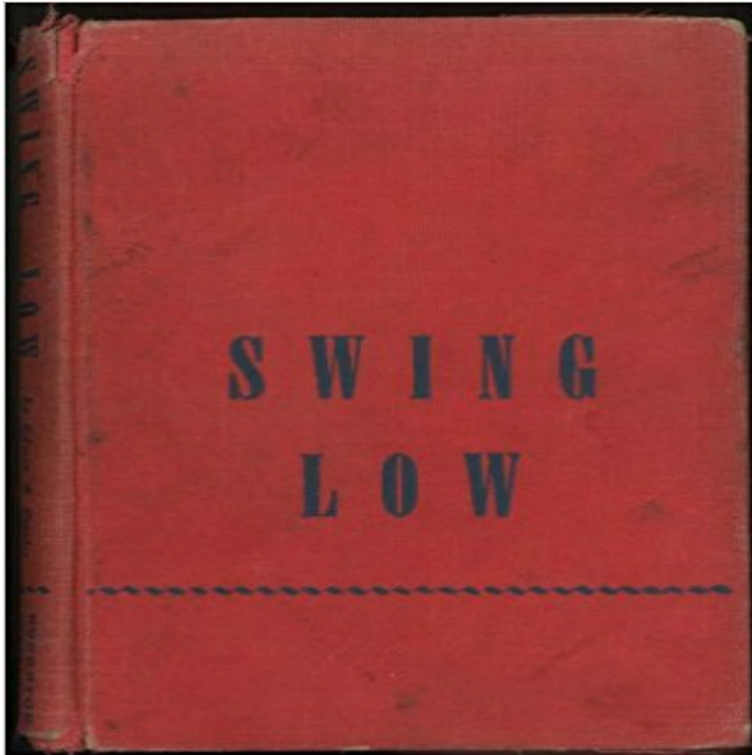


SWING LOW



Nearly forty years before *THE COLOR PURPLE*, another novel painted the black American experience with stunning frankness, immaculate detail and a heart-wrenching lyricism. Set in the slums of 1939 Atlanta, Edwin A. Peeples 1945 novel *SWING LOW* is a searing, yet tender drama of man-child Willie Mack, who comes with his wife Amy from the fields of southern Georgia to find his fortune in Billiard Hollow and is swept up in the stark realities of life in the underside of an Atlanta few would care to remember. In 1946, *SWING LOW* was a number-one best-seller in England. Possibly only the political sensitivity of its subject here in the USA and its unflinchingly raw depiction of the way things were (and not as revisionists thought they ought to have been) kept it from reprint and paperback. To post civil-rights generations (especially those raised in an era of political correctness and historical revisionism) who never experienced them, the vernacular and social landscape depicted here may defy belief -and even elicit anger.
