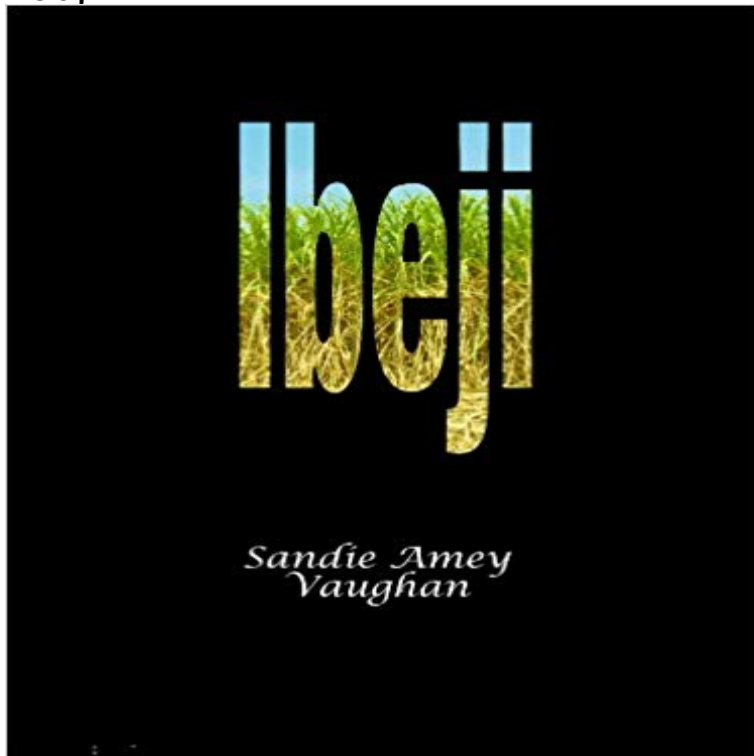


Ibeji
