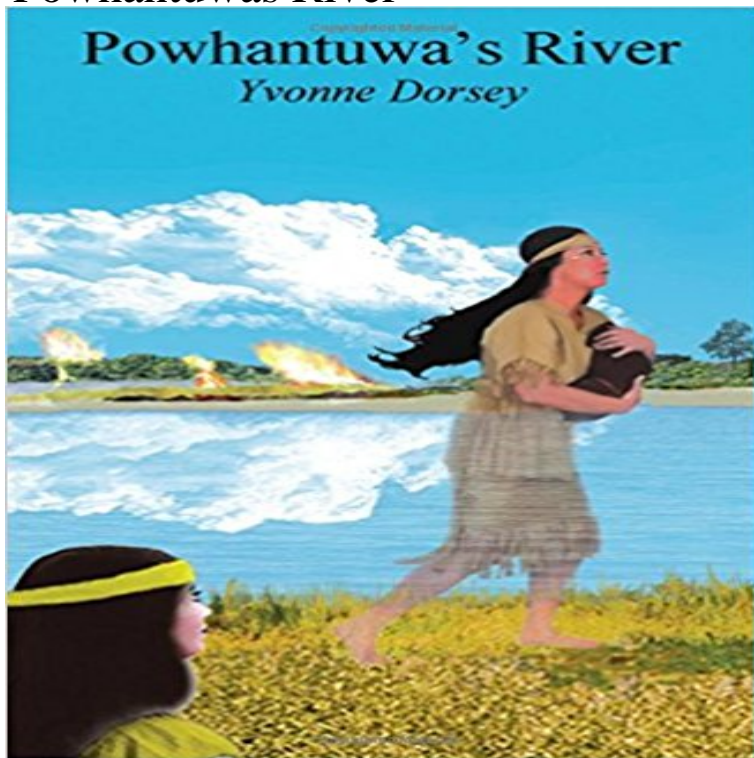


Powhantuwas River
