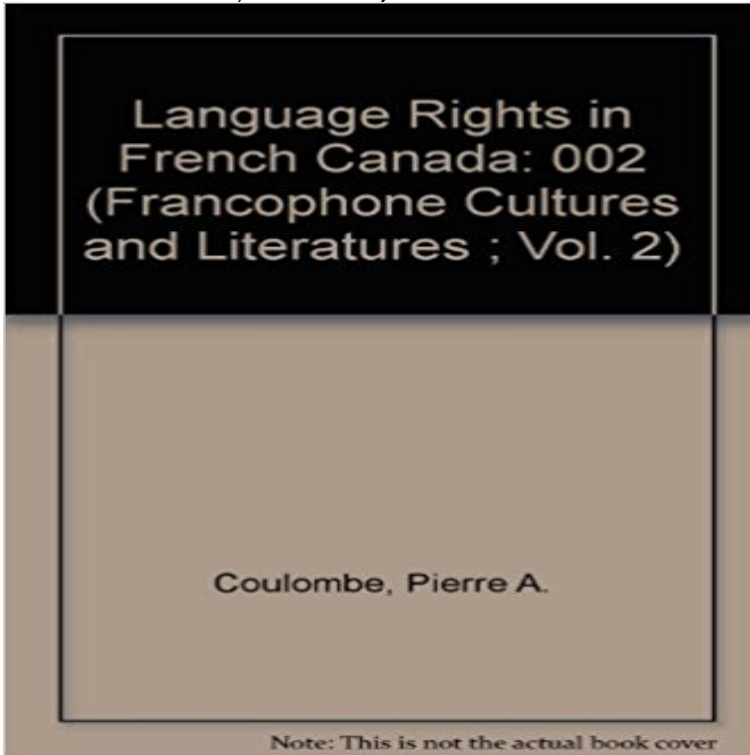


Language Rights in French Canada (Francophone Cultures and Literatures ; Vol. 2)

This book makes a compelling case for recognizing strong language rights as a matter of justice. Pierre A. Coulombe addresses critical issues about the coexistence of language communities in Canada, issues that will surely resonate in multilingual America.
