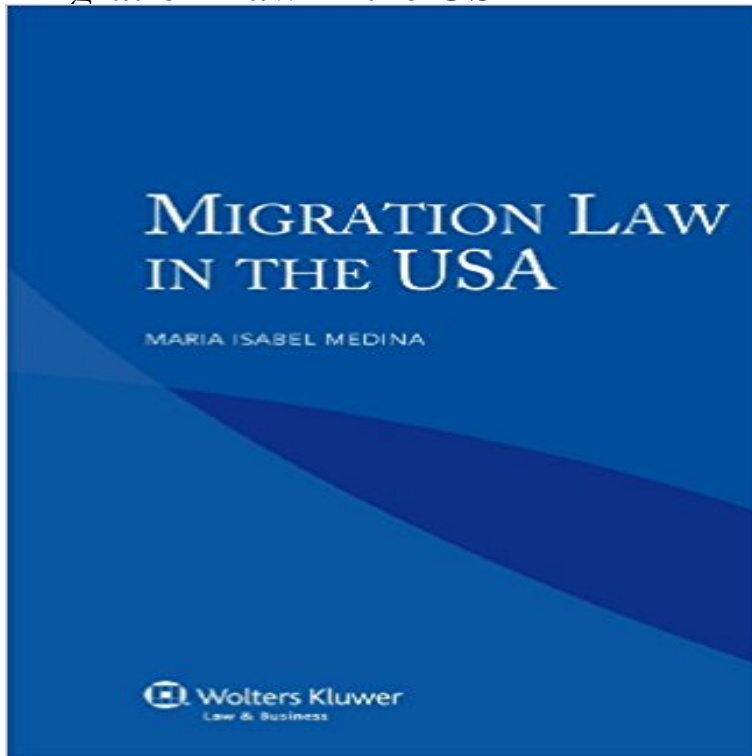


## Migration Law in the USA
