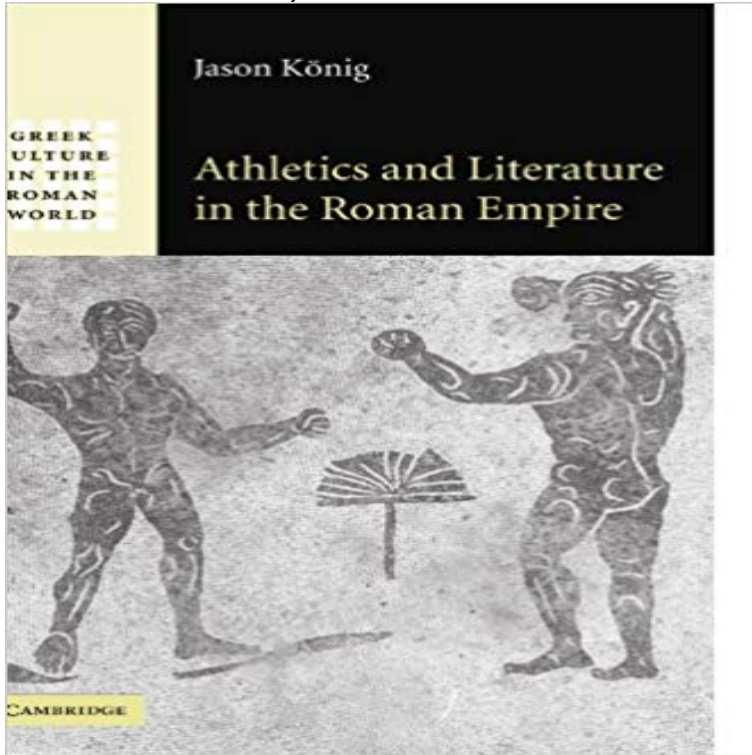


Athletics and Literature in the Roman Empire (Greek Culture in the Roman World)
