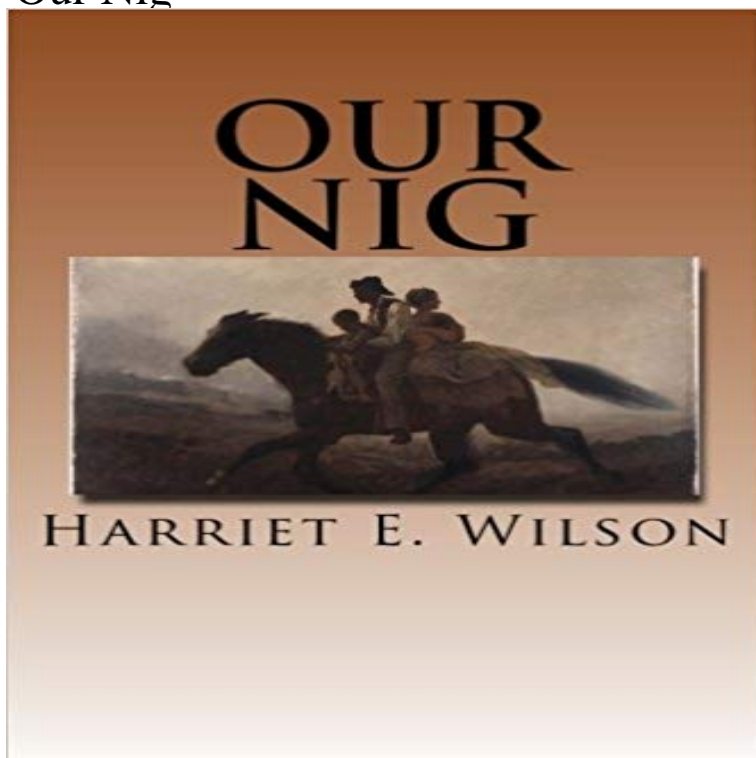


Our Nig
