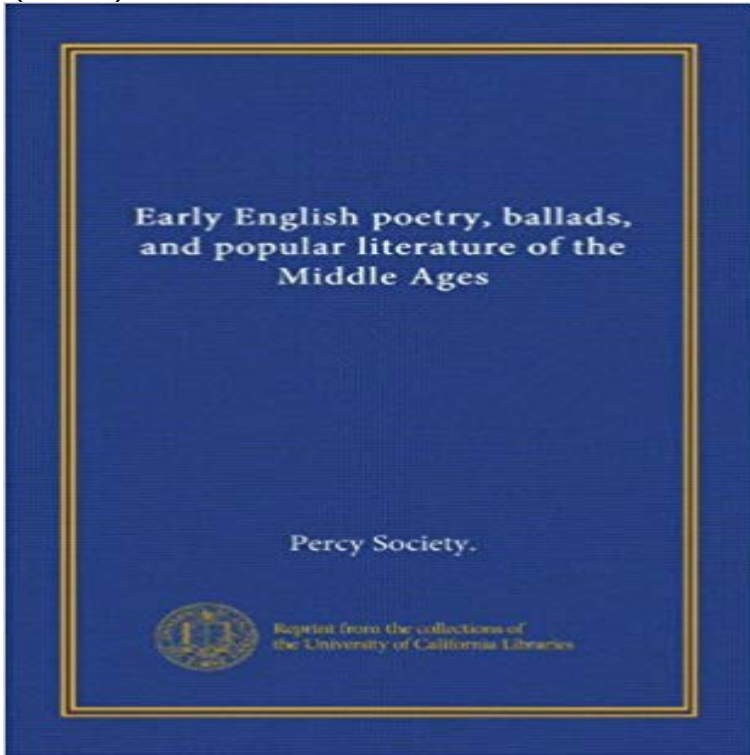


Early English poetry, ballads, and popular literature of the Middle Ages (v.07)
