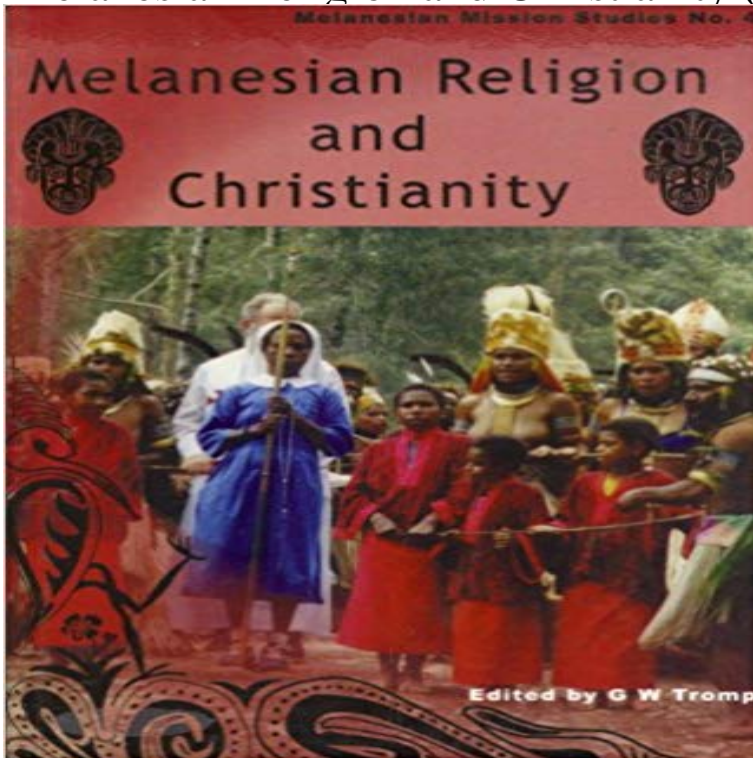


Melanesian Religion and Christianity (Melanesian Mission Studies, 4)
