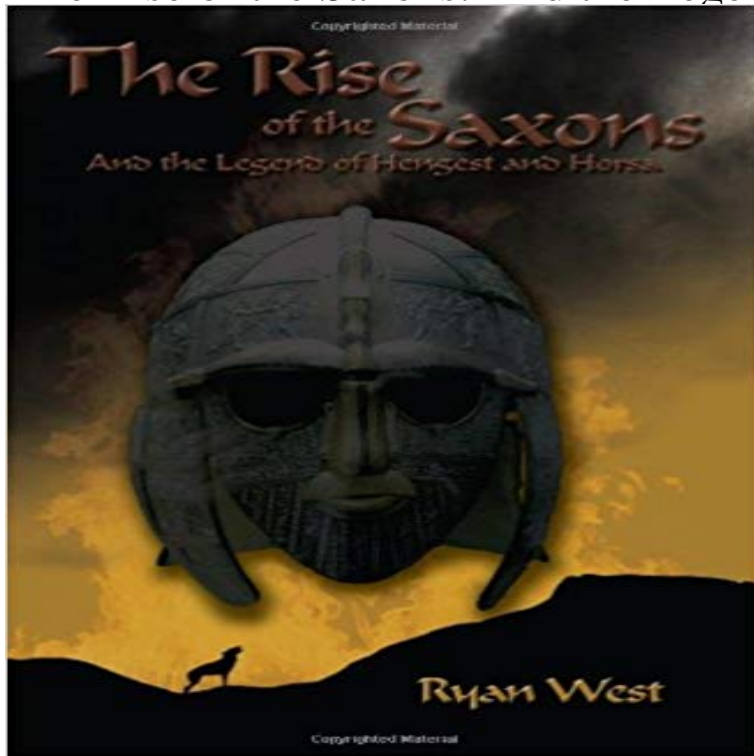


## The Rise of the Saxons: And the Legend of Hengest and Horsa
