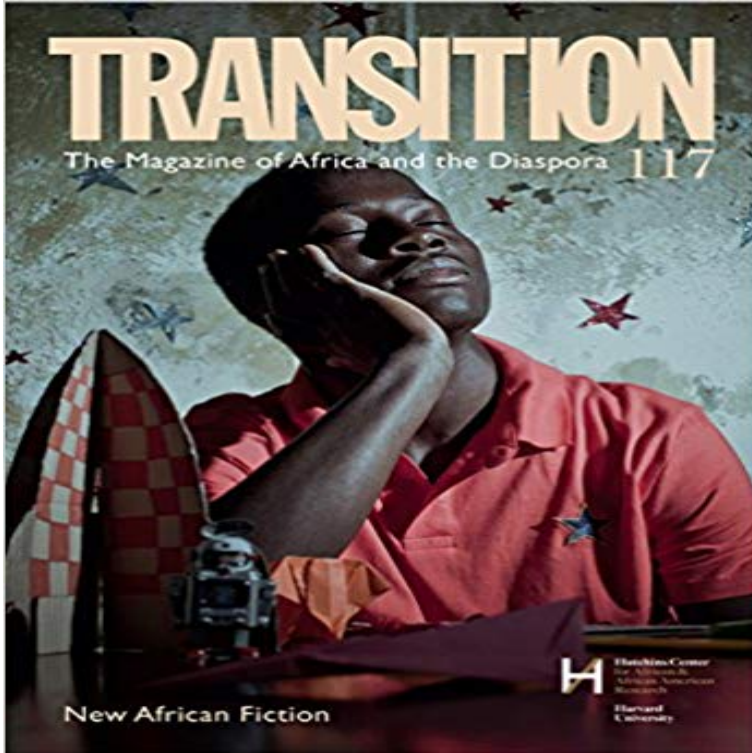


New African Fiction: Transition 117: The Magazine of Africa and the Diaspora
